We think 2022 is going to be an expensive one and we thank you all for your continuing support.



Annette and Richard, John, John, Terry, Anne and Lynne ensure our dogs have been receiving regular walks. Thank you to all.


We also need to say Thankyou to **Sheila** who has visited so many homes doing our home visits, wearing her mask and staying as Covid safe as possible.

Pandemic Shortages.

3.2 million pets were purchased in the UK during the pandemic!

Enquiries increased by 253% during lockdown across all rescues and breeders. There were some shortages in the supplies of pet food as a result. However the biggest problem from this surge has got to be the shortage of vets and vet nurses, resulting in many practices having to close their doors to new clients.

With restrictive new work practises and vets burning out from the stress, it has been increasingly difficult to get appointments for all but emergencies. There is now a national shortage of cat vaccines. We were using 5 different vets, yet still having problems.

Saddest of all were the owners unable to be with their beloved pets at the end of their lives. Thank fully this is beginning to change as vets allow owners back into the clinics. But the shortage of vets may well be a long-term problem.

Thank you to Wickham Court for choosing Second Chance as one of their nominated charities this year.

From their fundraising events so far they have raised £833.50! Thank you!

When we can't help

We received a call from a lady who was distraught. She had found a cat collapsed on her door step. Hardly moving, the cat had maggots around its tail. But sadly the cat was in such a poor state that there was only one kind solution and that was that the cat was to be put to sleep. With no microchip we were only able to share online and no owner came forward.

Months of no cats to be rehomed and everyone phoning for cats, then all of a sudden there are dozens wanting homes!

Many of these cats were being fed throughout the lockdown and with people moving around more, these kind people are looking for forever homes for the strays. But were they all strays? We have been able to reunite a number of cats through their microchip details to the delight of their owners. I know we keep banging on about chipping but we believe it an essential part of showing you care for your pet. It is not the vet who is responsible for registering the chip, it's you the owner. It saves heartache if your pet goes missing, they can be picked up, scanned and reunited.

The amazing Marion Burdett has our gratitude for spending so much time socialising the most difficult of cats. All of which have gone on to loving homes.

Thank you **Amber Edwards** of Stubbington who raised £180 for us by going on a sponsored slim. A great achievement by a young person.

Clyde

Do you remember reading the story of Bonnie and Clyde? Clyde was the cat with Cerebellar Hypoplasia known as a 'wobbly cat', that we were asked to rehome. We found an amazing lady in Shoreham who wanted to give them a home together, fully understanding the commitment required. Faith spent ages helping him with his mobility and when she thought she had done all she could she contacted a vet specialising in alternative treatments. Clyde had a number of sessions of acupuncture and the last video she

sent showed him running after a pigeon trying to catch it. We were so impressed we have been taking Miracle, our wobbly cat for treatment. We doubt he will ever be able to walk like Clyde but something is happening. He is so much stronger and although his legs still go in different directions when he walks in his harness he can now put his feet down on the ground and play football in his harness.

Goose

Goose the entire male from Portchester was picked up by us with his collar caught round his neck and under his arm, we mentioned his predicament in the last newsletter in the summer. It was a stark warning to make sure that if your cat has to wear a collar to make sure it's neither too loose or too tight and it's a safety collar so the cat can escape if he is caught by it. The area under the arm is such a difficult area to heal and each time it was stitched back together it would break open after the slightest of movement.

Finally, a decision had to be made and in November the leg was amputated. It was a hard decision to make but at least he will be able to go out when it is properly healed. Barbara, his foster mum who has been looking after him throughout, has decided that after such a time with so many highs and lows it would be unfair to rehome him. I think we realised that before her and certainly the vets did. Maybe it was something to do with the fact that every time he was kept at the vets, she visited him?



Without the fostering facilities given to us by Helen and John, we would be unable to rehome the number of cats we find forever homes for.

Our personal thanks to them for looking after Miracle and his sister Star when we have a short break.

A big thank you to **Stephanie** and **Jan** who get up at silly o'clock to sell at boot sales for us and have raised over £4500 this year paying the money straight into the vets to come off our bill.

You may remember that at the start of Lockdown we lost Alfie our Bichon– Frise who had an amazing personality and frequently made us laugh. He left a big hole in our lives but we had Charlie Farley and Stevie Girl to help us with the loss.

Alas, Charlie Farley died at the end of lockdown. We brought him home from Second Chance when he was 6 months old, having been born at the rescue. Rose said no one wanted him as he was 'ugly', we thought him the most handsome mongrel we had ever seen. Yes he was 15 when we lost him,

so a good age and not wholly unexpected.

On 4 separate occasions in the past 10 years we had not expected him to survive due to illness or on one occasion a foreign body causing a blockage, but Greg and his amazing team pulled him through each time. He was poorly in July and yet again they pulled him through, this time it was Saffiya-al-Hafidh at The Grove who worked the miracle.

We recorded him playing ball on the green and the following day swimming near Portchester Castle, 2 days later he was put to sleep. He had so much personality and enjoyed life to the full and we were honoured to have had the pleasure of him for so many years.
